## An Easter Message from Bishop Denis

I love the refrain that carries us through these past Triduum days "Christ was humbler yet, even to accepting death on a cross, but God raised him high" There was that sense of the refrain building up as each day of the Triduum passes. Everything is there in those few words and Easter is the greatest celebration in the cycle of our Church. We make a lot of Lent, I think, sometimes to the neglect of Easter.

The Sacred Triduum allowed us to walk with Jesus in his pain and desolation. It brought us many places, from a procession where palms were waving to an upper room, to a garden, and then to a hill, like no other hill.

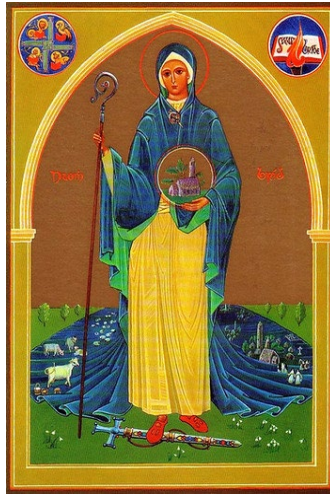
Yesterday we waited at the tomb, with that feeling that God was absent.

Then comes the great Easter Vigil as we read scripture, light candles, baptise new members of the church and celebrate the Eucharist. Easter lasts much longer than a vigil night, splendid as that celebration may be. Easter lasts for fifty days.

As we journey these days, may we hold in our prayers those who need most to hear that "God raised him high". God will be with us all and raise us with him; this is the hope of the new beginnings that Easter promises.

## HOLY WEEK

*Palm Sunday launches the Church's Great Week. Jesus enters Jerusalem for the last time to the cheers of the crowds. A humble donkey is his mount. The city is packed as pilgrims arrive to celebrate Passover. Today the mood is one of huge support for Jesus. In a few days they will be shouting "Crucify him, crucify him!"*

*Holy Thursday brings us back to the last Supper. Like all Jews these men celebrated the Passover. Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and with the bread and wine he gave us his Body and Blood in the Eucharist. Judas left the room to betray Jesus - for 30 pieces of silver.*

*Good Friday is the only day we don't have Mass (resurrection is at the heart of Mass, and today is not the day) the whole focus is on the death of Jesus. We journey to Calvary. We pause there at the cross. We try to take it in. We pray.*

*Holy Saturday is a day of waiting and preparing for the greatest celebration in our year of faith, the Easter Vigil, the fire, the Paschal Candle, the readings, the blessing of the Easter Baptismal Water, the Alleluias, the Mass which is our greatest word of thanks*

## **Treasure Ireland**

A new video series launched recently by the Irish Dominicans is an ambitious project that will take the friars to every county in Ireland, filming roughly ten videos in each county, highlighting the many and varied stories that make up the history of Irish Christianity.

The series is currently focussed on the counties which overlap with the territory of the diocese of Kildare and Leighlin: Laois, Kildare, Carlow, and (soon!) Kilkenny.

Some of the sites visited include Timahoe, the Rock of Dunamase, and the Brownshill Dolmen. The story of Jesuit photographer, Fr Frank Browne, is told in a video recorded in Emo Court, and that of pioneering scientist, Fr Nicholas Callan, in a video from Maynooth.

The stories of the great saints of these counties feature prominently: there are videos on St Brigid, St Mochua, St Moling, St Fergal of Aghaboe, and the Dominican martyr, Blessed Peter O’Higgins. There’ll soon be added to that list the stories of two great bishops of Kildare and Leighlin: Daniel Delany (d. 1814) and James Doyle (d. 1834), also known as J.K.L. (‘James of Kildare and Leighlin’).

All of these stories are told in a way designed to interest believers and non-believers alike, showing, bit by bit, that the Gospel is woven inseparably into the fabric of Irish history.

Comhairle groups were set up to give children and young people (under the voting age of 18) a voice in the development of local services and policies. ## **A message from an Garda Siochana**

An Garda Siochana wish to warn people of a doorstep fraud and theft offence which has become prevalent over the last number of weeks.

Elderly People are being targeted at their homes by Criminals who are impersonating Gardaí. The offenders are fraudulently pretending to be plain clothes Gardaí who are checking for dud money. They have duped people all around the country and stolen their cash on the pretence of checking to see if it is genuine money. They are producing false identification to assist the process.

### **Advice:**

- An Garda Siochana will never ask people about their finances on the doorstep of their homes and will never ask to check money
- Always ask for Identification and do not be afraid to question it. If in doubt politely tell the caller that you want to verify their true identity. If necessary contact your local Garda Station who will be able to establish quickly if the caller is a member of An Garda Siochana.
- Report any such activity to your local Garda Station even if you have not been the victim of a theft. That report could save a neighbour or someone else close by.
- Please check on elderly neighbours, family and friends and advise and reassure them
